Ellen Granberg, PhD, is Senior Associate Provost and Professor of Sociology at Clemson University. Dr. Granberg acts as the provost's primary deputy and has responsibility for strategic planning, academic operational effectiveness and faculty excellence. In addition, Dr. Granberg serves as co-chair of the University's strategic plan, <u>ClemsonForward</u>, and is currently leading the campus-wide implementation.

As Professor of Sociology, Dr. Granberg's research and teaching interests focus on micro-social factors such as stress that influence physical and mental health. She has authored numerous peer reviewed publications and has been principle investigator or co-investigator on \$8 million in grants from the National Institute of Mental Health, the United States Department of

Agriculture, and the Department of Defense. From 2012-2015 she chaired the Department of Sociology and Anthropology at Clemson. She has been a faculty member at Clemson since 2001.

Prior to pursuing an academic career, Dr. Granberg spent a decade at Pacific Bell Corporation as a senior project manager and technical director. During that time she led a team responsible for replacing commercial and residential billing systems serving 14 million customers. She oversaw the overall project trajectory and led communication and coordination among major stakeholders including Pacific Bell's marketing and technology departments, two consulting partners (Anderson Consulting/Accenture and KPMG), and major external billing customers including AT&T, Sprint, and MCI.

Dr. Granberg earned a BA in History at the University of California at Davis and an MA and PhD in Sociology at Vanderbilt University.
